3. BUSINESS ARISING

3.1 PLACE PLAN ANNUAL REVIEWS

- Each completed Place Plan will be reviewed annually as a means to report progress on action items and update action items
 - It is noted that newly identified projects can be added to the Place Plans through this process
- Vincent Town Centre Place Plan, North Perth Town Centre Place Plan, and Mount Hawthorn Town Centre Place Plan reviews are scheduled to be reported at 17 November 2020 Ordinary Council Meeting
- It is noted that the remaining four Town Centre Place Plans will be completed by the end of 2020/21 financial year



4. GENERAL BUSINESS

4.1 VINCENT REBOUND PLAN

- The Vincent Rebound Plan is reported monthly to the COVID Committee, and quarterly to Council
- o TG to include the link to this months' implementation table with the meeting minutes
- In future, TG to send the link to the implementation table updates with the agenda to allow attendees to review in advance and facilitate conversation at the roundtable meeting
- DG notes there are concerns surrounding a neon sign (Arts Relief Grant project) being placed in Leederville. KB to put DG in contact with Tegan Patrucco (Arts and Activation Officer)

4.2 TOWN TEAM UPDATES

- Leederville Connect updates from DG:
 - Currently collating feedback on the draft Leederville Town Centre Place Plan to send to BF
 - Design sub-committee has a meeting planned with Main Roads WA
 - Early discussions surrounding how to build and design a compassionate City/Village, and how to shift the focus from acute response to strategic pathways for mental health and other community supports
 - SS notes the Youth Action Plan is a good resource to reference in this space
 - Hesperia to provide a briefing regarding the Hotel redevelopment to Leederville Connect at the next committee meeting
 - Leederville Chamber of Commerce emerging with the intent to upskill businesses, host business breakfasts, and promote Leederville as the brand/culture
 - "Republic of Leederville" merchandise currently being produced
- Beaufort Street Network Updates from KH:
 - Currently refreshing their Action Plan to reflect the interests and priorities of the current committee, and changing their constitution to reflect the Town Team Movement model
 - Place Plan is currently being developed by JJM and takes into consideration a project completed by UWA Landscape Architecture students in 2019
 - Continuing to host monthly Quiz Nights and Serenades
 - Business community has been very receptive to serenades and Beaufort Street Network is considering extending them beyond the three month trial
 - Town Team Movement Convergence being hosted on Beaufort Street
 - Local businesses are becoming increasingly interested in being involved and collaborating with Beaufort Street Network
 - The new tenant in the Flying Scotsman building are keen to involve the community in naming the new pub
 - KH notes there are signs of renewed interest in investment on Beaufort Street
 - In the planning stages of Dogtober and the Christmas festival, but uncertain about scope for Christmas due to a lack of funding
 - SS and SG note quarterly reviews of the budget may see additional funding become available to Town Teams
 - KH notes Beaufort Street Network is investigating alternative funding sources to become more sustainable
 - It is noted that sustainability is important for all Town Teams to consider
