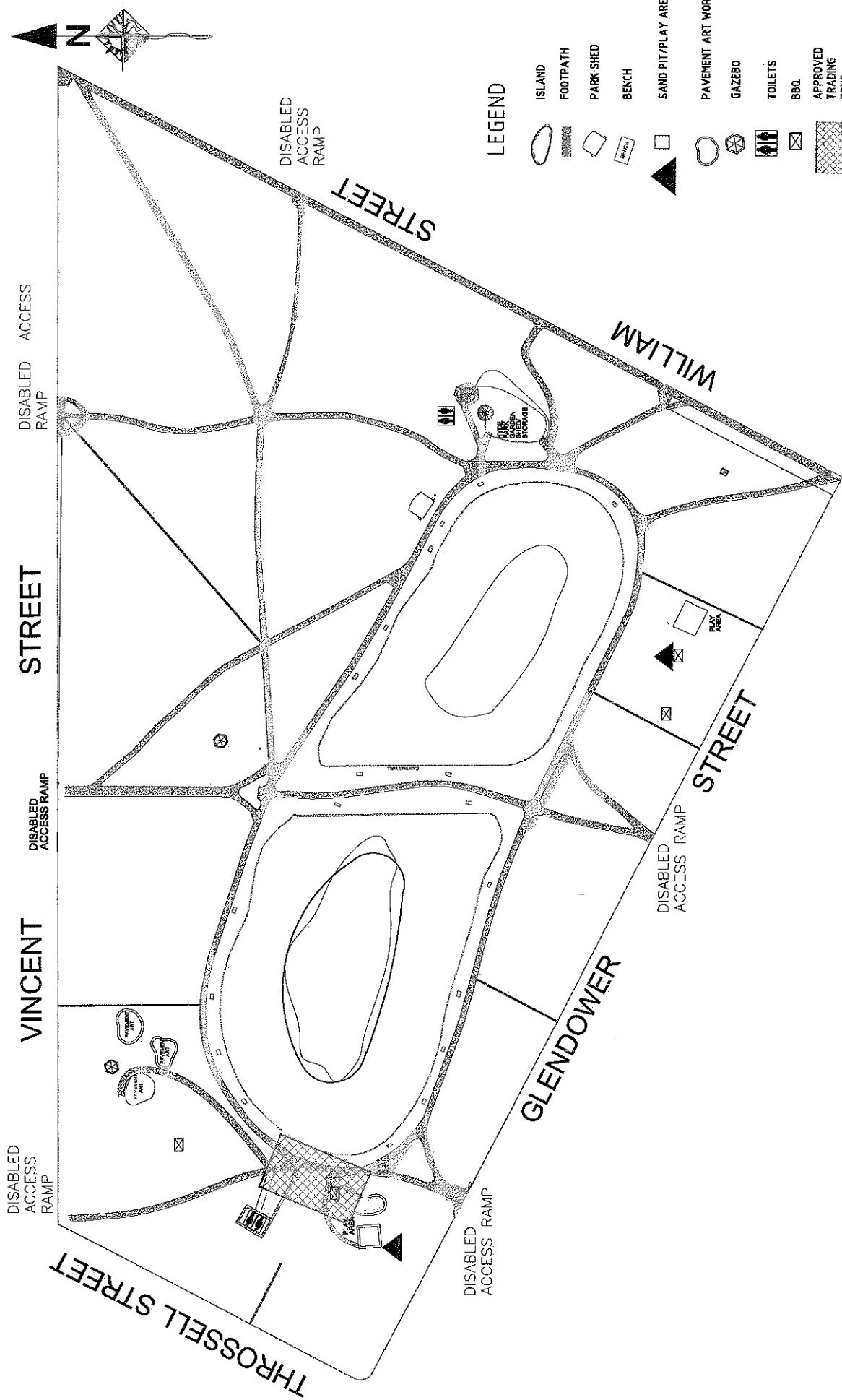



MOBILE FOOD VENDOR EVALUATION CRITERIA – EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

The following particular evaluation criteria shall be applied in the assessment of the expressions of interest.

The applications will be assessed with the following qualitative and compliance criteria to determine the most advantageous outcome to the City. It is essential that Contractor address each criterion. The Responses will be used to select the chosen Contractor, and failure to provide the specified information may result in elimination from the Response evaluation process.

Evaluation Criteria	Weighting
<p>Relevant experience, expertise and project Team Demonstrate your:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Experience, expertise and project team. • Role and credentials of the key persons in the provision of the service (that is; qualifications and experience). • Demonstrate adequate knowledge in food handler hygiene. • Demonstrate compliance with the requirements of the <i>Food Act 2008</i> and <i>FSANZ Food Standards Code</i> (guidelines can be obtained from the City's Health Services). • Understanding of the requirements associated with delivering the services to the City. Experience and success in the sphere of recent similar facilities. • Willingness to participate in the City's MenuWise programme (details available here: http://www.vincent.wa.gov.au/Services/Health/Your_Health/Public_Health_Promotions/MenuWise). 	50%
<p>History and viability of Company</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Detail your history, viability and experience. • Demonstrate your capacity and depth to effectively address the range of requirements of the City. • Demonstrate your capacity to provide a new and exciting service to the City's residents that is not currently provided by local businesses. 	20%
<p>Methodology, key issues and risks Demonstrate:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Details of the service to be provided, addressing in particular the food handling procedures in place, and measures to control waste and noise. • Details of the preferred location and proposed operating hours of the service. • Provide detailed plan of proposed Mobile Food Vehicle infrastructure layout. • Details/Samples of menus for the service. • Details of current Public Liability Insurance. • Understanding of the required service by identifying the key issues and risks associated with delivering the project. 	20%

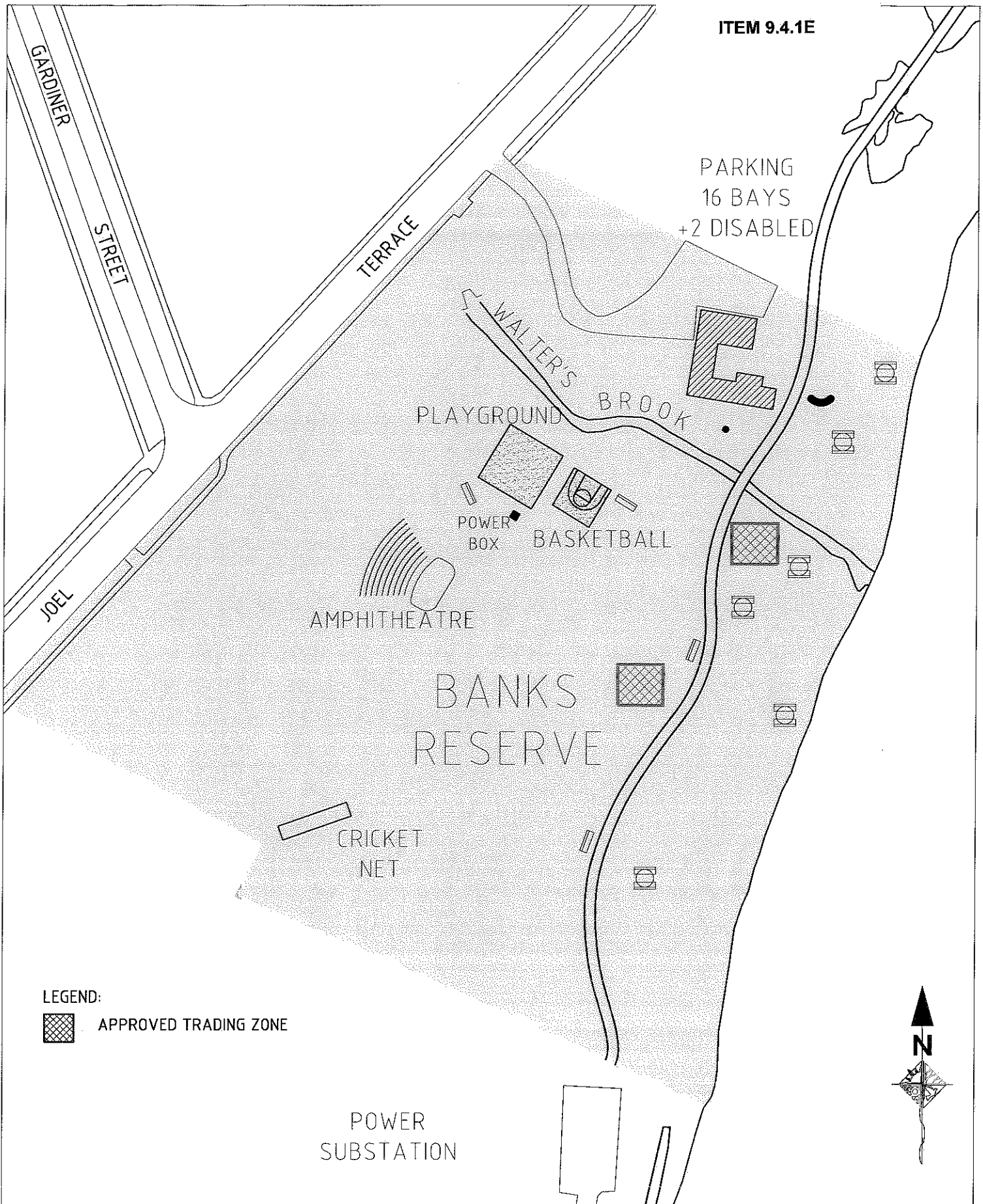
