Welcome Meeting 3 August 2021

Last week on Tuesday 3 August 2021, we met with panel members for the first time at the Welcome Meeting held at the City of Vincent Community Hall. There were a couple of collaborative activities during the welcome meeting, based around establishing the panel and including forming some 'ground rules' for etiquette, understanding how we will reach agreement and general Q&A about the panel and about the first project the panel will be working together on; the draft Asset Management and Sustainability Strategy.

Ground Rules

When discussing panel member etiquette, we asked the present panel members to identify some 'ground rules'. Here's what they came up with as a group:

- Keep jargon to a minimum accessible language
- Understand the role of the decision maker
- Time to contribute (& spare)
- Be positive in your feedback constructive
- Seek diversity in discussions
- Maintain level emotions
- · Focus on the issues to find actions

What does agreement look like?

- Identifying the issues that can't be solved and park them
- Declare conflicts and biases (eq. land developer) and move on
- Majority rules? Depending on topic other topics need full agreement
- Other data on the table to be collected
- Collaborative decision making per table
 - o Drill down and find out why someone disagrees
 - Dig deeper to understand


The following questions were asked during the meeting. We will collect these and create a rolling 'FAQ' for the panel – to be updated in due course.

- What is the annual budget and what percentage is the AMSS?
- How do we compare to other councils in terms of our upgrades?
- Do developments increase revenue for assets? eg. new ABN building neutral impact
- Will increasing cost of parking help to increase revenue?
- Do all assets have an asset rating?
- Buildings are in disproportion to our budget? Are there any other areas that are disproportionate?
- Are our rates in line with other councils re: asset needs?
- Does the age of the City affect our asset issues?
- Are Beatty Park and Litis Stadium the biggest 'drains'? If the City dealt with these would it help the budget?

• Are we making decisions on behalf of ourselves or on behalf of the City?

For the next two meeting in the workshop series, we will consider Wednesday nights as the preferrable date based on the feedback from the first session. The preferred date and time of a session will be reviewed as the panel evolves.
