The new plan builds on the foundations of the past and seeks to consolidate its successful strategies, actions and outcomes and combine them with modern and innovative improvements and ideas designed to meet the City and community's needs into the future.

#### Goal of the Plan

## SAFER VINCENT CRIME PREVENTION PARTNERSHIP (SVCPP)

The City facilitates the Safer Vincent Crime Prevention Partnership (SVCPP), of which the City, elected members, WA Police and local community representatives are all active participants, working collaboratively with the common aim to tackle community safety and crime prevention concerns. The City's SVCPP Committee has evolved to achieve a diverse representation reflective of the Vincent Community with representatives from areas including;

- » WA Police
- » Council Elected members and City officers
- » Seniors
- » Youth

- » Local Business operators
- » Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CaLD) group members
- » State and Non-Government Peak agencies

#### Stakeholder Consultation

A series of evaluation and reviews of the previous 2010 -2014 Plan were undertaken in mid to late 2014 by the City's Officers, the SVCPP Committee, local WA Police representatives, community precinct group members and a number of other stakeholder organisation representatives. As a consequence, the review and evaluation process helped form the basis for the development of this current plan, its new contemporary strategies and priority objectives and actions.

A subsequent launch of the new community safety and crime prevention plan was held at the City of Vincent Administration Building on 26 October 2015. An overview of the new strategies and priorities was provided to the diverse audience which included members of stakeholder groups mentioned in this plan and a community feedback session from the City's residents.

The feedback discussions identified community safety and crime prevention priorities for the Partnership and current criminal and anti-social activity impacting upon the City's residents. A process to monitor and evaluate community safety perceptions and crime prevention and discussions surrounding the new strategies and initiatives in this plan were highlighted.

Overwhelming endorsement of the new Community Safety and Crime Prevention Plan 2015 – 2018 was received from the attendees and is an encouraging sign that the City, its stakeholder representatives and the community are committed to working together in unity to achieve positive safety and crime prevention outcomes for all our residents and visitors.

#### STRATEGY FOCUS & OVERVIEW

### STRATEGY 1 - Community Safety Promotion and Awareness

The City acknowledges the importance of the community being aware of safety issues within their environment and in promoting practical steps that can assist to reduce or discourage crime from happening. To better equip the community and deter opportunities for crime, this strategy's focus has an emphasis on community education, developing local resources on safety and crime prevention and greater access to safety resources and reference material to assist in achieving this goal. This strategy further promotes 'Ease of Access' to the City's Rangers, Community Development, Health and Technical Services assets through improved community and stakeholder reporting to achieve positive outcomes and build greater resilience, making the City a safer and more desirable place to be.

## STRATEGY 2 - Safety through Effective Partnerships

Community safety and crime prevention within the City is best achieved through the development of strategic partnerships with key stakeholders in order to provide a holistic perspective on matters impacting on our community. Contemporary approaches to safety and crime prevention are no longer just relegated to WA Police, but are the responsibility of the whole community working together to develop and implement innovative ideas and strategies. This strategy focuses on relationship building and complementing the City's ongoing key stakeholder synergies aimed towards increasing community safety and crime prevention.

## STRATEGY 3 – Safe Places and Safe Spaces

This strategy's focus is the development and enhancement of the City's built and landscaped environments in which people can feel safe and spaces that welcome and encourage active and healthy participation in the community. It seeks to address matters impacting on the positive use of public spaces including parks, commercial areas and the entertainment precincts within the City, for increased social benefit. This strategy encompasses actions to further develop and maintain the City's assets as welcoming places and includes Crime Prevention through Environmental Design (CPTED) principles and other proactive strategies to deter and reduce anti-social behaviour.
