## **Enrolment and voting**

## Why should you enrol and vote?

All eligible people are required to enrol and vote in federal and state elections. You may be fined if you don't.

#### When should you enrol?

If you are not on the roll when a federal election is called, you may not have time to enrol to vote. ENROL NOW.

## Are you eligible?

You are eligible to enrol and vote if you:

- are an Australian citizen, or a British subject who was enrolled on 25 January 1984 (and – for Western Australian elections only – if you were a British subject enrolled between 26 October 1983 and 25 January 1984 inclusive); and
- are 18 years or older; and
- have lived at your address for at least one month.

You may enrol when you are 17, but you cannot vote until you are 18.

## **Special enrolment**

Contact the Australian Electoral Commission for more information and special application forms if you:

- have no fixed address
- are temporarily overseas
- are in prison
- are physically incapable of signing your name
- are working in Antarctica
- cannot attend a polling place on polling day
- believe that having your address shown on a publicly available roll may endanger your safety or that of your family.

#### What happens when you return your form?

Your application is checked and your name and address is placed on the electoral roll for federal, state and local government elections if you are eligible.

If you have not received written confirmation of your enrolment within 3 weeks of applying, please call the Australian Electoral Commission on **13 23 26**.

Authorisation to collect the information on this form is contained in the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918* and the Western Australian *Electoral Act 1907*.

## Who has access to your enrolment information

#### The general public

The electoral roll can be inspected at any Australian Electoral Commission office or the office of the Western Australian Electoral Commission. Only names and addresses are provided on the publicly available roll.

#### The Commonwealth of Australia

Under the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918, enrolment information is given to -

- Members of Parliament and registered political parties includes title, name and address, postal address, date of birth and gender.
- Candidates for House of Representatives elections.
- The electoral authorities of those states and territories that have entered into a joint roll arrangement with the Commonwealth includes title, name and address, postal address, date of birth and gender of electors in other states and territories.
- Approved medical research and public health screening programs includes name and address, gender and age range minimum span 2 years.
- Australian government agencies such as Centrelink, the Australian Taxation Office and the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade – may include name and address, date of birth and gender to assist in investigation and prevention of breaches of the law, or protection of public revenue. A full list of agencies entitled to this information is available from www.aec.gov.au and the Australian Electoral Commission.

## The State of Western Australia

Similar information to that provided to Commonwealth agencies is provided by the Western Australian Electoral Commission to state agencies for law enforcement and medical research and to local governments for electoral purposes.

## Proof of identity

You must prove your identity for COMMONWEALTH electoral enrolment How do you prove your identity?

If you have an **Australian driver's licence** provide the details at Question 8 on PAGE A.

#### You will only need to complete and return PAGE A

If you don't have an Australian driver's licence you need an authorised person (see PAGE B) to sight an original of ONE of the documents listed on PAGE B. You will need to complete and return PAGE A and PAGE B OR

If you don't have an Australian driver's licence AND you don't have any of the documents listed on PAGE B, you need **TWO people who are enrolled and have known you for at least one month to confirm your identity** (see PAGE C).

You will need to complete and return PAGE A and PAGE C
