It's Leederville's turn for some sprucing up! The community feedback we gathered last year from residents, businesses, café crawlers and Leederville lovers is now helping us implement a suite of enhancements and upgrades that will transform the Leederville Town Centre – and the Oxford Street Reserve redevelopment is the pinnacle project.

Reserve works commence » February 2014 Playground works commence » April 2014 Completion date for all works » June 2014

NEW OXFORD STREET RESERVE PLANS



- » Extend the park to the north up to the coffee shop 'Cranked' and close access into the carpark from Oxford Street (a major pedestrian link from Oxford Street/rail foot bridge)
- » A unique and interesting children's nature playground fenced and extended to provide a secure area with creative play equipment
- » Additional raised and shaded seating areas that provide an uninterrupted view of the playground (for parents to relax with a coffee)
- » Existing large Canary Island date palm retained as a focal point, with new landscaping and seating
- » Working with YMCA HQ skate park to develop the southern end of the park as an active urban play area with outdoor ping pong and chess tables
- » 45-degree angle parking bays maintained and streetscape planting to screen off the carpark
- » Crime prevention through environmental design (CPTED) principles will be incorporated to ensure the park is open, well lit and safe for everyone
