

What is Earth Carers?

Did you know?

- That each year nearly 1.5 tonnes of waste per household is generated;
- When we throw things into the household bin we're wasting useful resources;
- The rubbish we produce threatens the environment;
- Recycling alone is not the answer to slowing our use of natural resources or reducing waste;
- We need to do more; and
- Research shows that people want to reduce the amount of rubbish they create, but want to know how.

Practical ways to reduce our waste

Earth Carers is about practical ways to reduce waste:

- Don't buy disposable products;
- Choose products with less packaging;
- Give your old items to charity;
- Choose products with re-usable or re-fillable containers:
- Start a compost heap or worm farm;
- Use non-toxic cleaning products in your home
