Stallholder Frequently Asked Questions

Where is the event being held?

- The event is being held at Braithwaite Park located on 197 Scarborough Beach Rd, Mount Hawthorn
- Stalls will be located inside the Lesser Hall, and outside on the reserve
- Limited free parking spaces are available around the park.
- Bus routes are frequent along Scarborough Beach Rd and Berryman Street, only a short walk from the event venue

How many stallholders will be at the event?

- We are seeking up to 80 stallholders for the Young Makers Christmas Market
- Once the capacity is filled, we will be accepting applications for the waitlist

How do I know if my application has been accepted?

- Once submitted, your stallholder application will be reviewed and if you meet the application guidelines, you will receive confirmation via email
- Applications may close earlier than advertised if the capacity has been reached before Monday, 27 October 2025

Can I busk and have a market stall at the event?

- Yes, each busker will receive a timeslot during the event. Make sure you have a friend to manage your market stall while you are busy busking
- Note: buskers are required to bring their own sound amplifier equipment if they wish to project their sound

Where will my stall be located?

- Your stall will be located around Braithwaite Park or inside the Lesser Hall
- Food stalls will be located inside the Lesser Hall
- If you have any special request or accessibility needs for your stall, please provide this information in your application form
- Please be descriptive on your stallholder application, this will assist us in planning your stallholder location for the day and avoid similar items being located next to each other
- Stallholder location will be distributed one week prior to the event

What equipment will be provided by the City of Vincent for the event?

- Each stallholder will be provided with their own free table space of 90cm x 75cm
- All stallholders will share a 1.8m trestle table – this means we can provide more local young people with the opportunity to host a stall (we had over 70 young people on the waitlist for a stall last year!)
- Shade (*gazebo*) will be provided for outdoor stallholders
- A cold-water refill station will be provided to refill drink bottles
- A low sensory space will be available for use

What equipment should I bring to the event?

- Chair – we recommend you bringing a stool or small fold-up chair
- Tablecloth for your half of the trestle table (90cm)
- Hand sanitiser for personal hygiene
- Water bottle to keep hydrated

- Sunscreen and hat
- Gloves if you are selling food not individually wrapped
- Please keep items limited to your trestle table, as we do not encourage items to be stuck to a gazebo
- Clothes racks and small display stands are permitted but will need to be set up within your stall space and not block or encroach on the stalls next to you
- Please list any extra display stands or clothes racks you wish to bring on your stallholder application – this will help us with event planning

Can I share my stall with a friend?

- Yes, you can share your allocated stall space with a friend
- Please let us know how many people will be sharing the table in your application form and their names, this will help with our event planning
- Siblings must share a stall, as only one free stall will be allocated per family.

Should I sell my items with cash or eftpos?

- You are welcome to bring your own eftpos/tap-and-go device. Please note there is no WIFI at the venue
- Remember to bring along a money float to ensure you have change for your sales
- The event is being promoted to attendees to be prepared and bring cash to purchase items

What time should I arrive to set-up and pack-down?

- The event will be running from 9am-1pm
- Stallholders can set up from 8am and it's recommended to finalise your set up by 8.45am, ready to sell
- Upon your arrival to the venue, please check-in with a staff member at the City of Vincent tent before setting up your stall
- Please commence pack-up straight after the event at 1pm, if you can please prioritise clearing your trestle table, as the tables will be packed up by an external provider
- Please vacate the venue by 2pm

What guidelines do I need to follow if I am selling homemade food?

- Only low risk foods prepared in a domestic kitchen are permitted (*for example; cakes, biscuits, jams, nougats, meringues, pickled onions, chutneys, relishes, or other shelf-stable foods*)
- Presence of any allergens must be declared at the food stall (*a list of allergens, if present, such as nuts, eggs, milk, gluten, and bee products*)
- Potentially hazardous food is not permitted (*for example; meat, salad, rice, seafood and cream etc*)
- Food must be stored in a closed container or items wrapped individually
- You must wear gloves or use tongs when handling food and a clean utensil should be used if one is dropped on the ground
- Ensure pre-packed and/or shelf-stable foods are not stored directly on the ground
- There must be hand sanitisers available at your stall
- Please be descriptive on your stallholder application, your market food stall is subject to approval by the City's Health Officers.

This year's event includes upcycled items – what does that mean?

- Upcycled items refers to items that are second-hand (think op-shop style). Instead of throwing them out, recycle and give the items a new life.
- Items can include clothing, books, games toys etc, and they should be in good condition

Can I fundraise for my community group / not-for-profit organisation?

- We encourage local community groups and not-for-profit organisations to fundraise by hosting a sausage sizzle at the event.
- Your group may be eligible to apply for a donation (up to \$500) towards your fundraising food stall. Contact us to find out more information.

Tips to make your stall to stand out on event day

- Display information at your stall to explain what you are selling and how you made it
- Let your buyers know something about you or what you are saving for
- Tell your friends and family about the event, the more attendees the better your sales will be!
