

MUNICIPAL HERITAGE INVENTORY INTRODUCTION

The City of Vincent (City) has a rich and diverse heritage demonstrated within its built and natural environment.

The Municipal Heritage Inventory (MHI) is a document that records places in our City that have cultural heritage value.

The City's MHI (which also serves as its Heritage List) exists pursuant to the *Planning and Development* (*Local Planning Schemes*) *Regulations 2015* (Regulations) and provides statutory protection for heritage places. The City considers the management and protection of its diverse heritage assets to be a strong priority. Places identified as having cultural heritage significance to the locality and entered on the MHI are considered to be worthy of conservation. Statutory guidelines are put into place to ensure heritage is given priority consideration when evaluating planning applications

WHAT MAKES A PLACE SIGNIFICANT?

Each place includes a **Statement of Significance** which is a specific and unique description of the key heritage qualities. A site or place is deemed to have heritage significance if it meets one or more of the following criteria:

- the place may have historical significance;
- the place may have been associated with an important individual or group of people;
- the place may be architecturally or aesthetically significant;
- the place may be a rare, fine or an intact example of its type;
- the place may demonstrate an important technical achievement; or
- the place may be highly valued by a community for social or spiritual reasons.

Details of the cultural heritage significance for each place is found on the Heritage Council of Western Australia's (HCWA) inHerit portal at <u>inherit.</u> <u>stateheritage.wa.gov.au/Public.</u>

HOW ARE PLACES ASSESSED FOR HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE?

Places are assessed in accordance with Local Planning Policy 7.6.2 Heritage Management -Assessment. This criteria is based on the principles outlined within the Burra Charter and well as the HCWA's Guidelines for the Assessment of Local Heritage Places.

STATE HERITAGE REGISTER OF HERITAGE PLACES

The State Register of Heritage Places (State Register). is a statutory list of places that represent the story of Western Australia's history and development.

Entry in the Register is reserved for places of State cultural heritage significance and is the highest recognition afforded at the State level. Heritage places are entered in the State Register after an assessment and registration process which includes extensive consultation with owners, local governments and other stakeholders.

If a development application involves a place listed on the State Register, comments from the HCWA will be sought and obtained prior to any decision being made by the City.

MUNICIPAL HERITAGE INVENTORY MANAGEMENT CATEGORIES

All places listed in the MHI are assigned a Management Category by the City which defines their level of significance and protection.

Management Category A - Conservation Essential

Places within this category are essential to the heritage of the City and also contain a high degree of integrity and authenticity. A number of properties within this category all also listed within the State Register.

Management Category B - Conservation Recommended

Places within this category contribute to the heritage of the City. They have some altered or modified elements, that do not necessarily detract from the overall significance of the place.

CENTRAL PERTH HERITAGE INVENTORY MANAGEMENT LEVELS

The Central Perth Heritage Inventory (CPHI) comprises a list of places of cultural heritage significance within the former Central Perth Redevelopment Area. They are classified into Heritage Precincts and Heritage Places and are assigned the following levels.

Historic Precinct of State Significance.

Historic Precinct of Local Significance.

- Level 1 Place of State Significance.
- Level 2 Place of Local Significance.
- Level 3 Place of Lesser Significance.
- Level 4 Historic Site.

DEVELOPING A HERITAGE PLACE

The State Register, MHI and CPHI provides listed places with statutory protection, meaning that development approval is required for any proposed modifications, additions or demolition. Applications will be assessed against the following state and local planning policies:

- State Planning Policy 3.5 Historic Heritage Conservation.
- State Planning Policy 7.3 Residential Design Codes.
- Local Planning Policy 7.1.1 Built Form.
- Local Planning Policy 7.6.1 Heritage Management - Guidelines for Heritage and Adjacent Places.
- Local Planning Policy: Heritage Area Guidelines.

INTRODUCTION

The Central Perth Heritage Inventory (CPHI) comprises a list of heritage places that are of cultural heritage significance to both local and state communities. The places listed in the CPHI are supported by a 'thematic history', which identifies the history, stories and events that have shaped Central Perth and are represented in the built environment. The thematic history is important as it informs the assessment of significance of the places.

The CPHI was developed in accordance with the provisions of the *Heritage Act 2018*, which requires all Local Governments to compile an inventory of heritage places as the foundation of sound local heritage planning. Prior to normalisation in November 2020, the Metropolitan Redevelopment Authority (DevelopmentWA) were the determining authority for development within this Central Perth Redevelopment Area.

The CPHI applies as a Heritage List under Local Planning Scheme No.2, until such time the City's Municipal Heritage Inventory is reviewed in accordance with the *Planning and Development Act* (Local Planning Scheme) Regulations 2015.

A summary of the cultural heritage significance is included in the following pages. Further detail on the cultural heritage significance for each place can be found on the place record forms within the <u>Central</u> <u>Perth Heritage Inventory</u>.

MANAGEMENT LEVEL

The Management Level for a place or precinct is related to its heritage value and will have significant influence on how the development of a place is to be managed (i.e. its 'desired outcome'). The Management Level is as important as the list of places itself to ensure appropriate future management of all places listed on the CPHI. The management levels are outlined below.

HERITAGE PRECINCTS

The redevelopment area contains a number of heritage precincts of both State and local significance. These are defined "groups of places that exhibit special qualities, and will generally be rare within a locality". The levels of significance for heritage precincts employed in the CPHI are identified in Table 1.

HERITAGE PLACES

The management levels of heritage places employed in the CPHI are identified in Table 2.


